Curriculum

It is the responsibility of the District to provide curriculum, course requirements and instruction consistent with the goals and expectations established in the Wisconsin State Statutes. The District will provide instruction and experiences in the following areas for students:

- Academic Skills and Knowledge
- Vocational Skills
- Citizenship
- Personal Development
- Safety

The curriculum consists of all the learning and experiences schools provide students. Curricular experiences include courses in art, business education, English, foreign languages, health, family/consumer education, technology education, language arts, library skills, mathematics, music, physical education, reading, safety, science, social studies, speech-drama, work experience, Co-operative Education, Youth Apprenticeship and Marketing Education. Instruction in financial literacy, spelling, hand writing and computer science are embedded into academic courses.
