Instruction

Summer School

The District generally offers to students summer programs K-12 that provide enrichment programs, remedial instruction, and senior high school original credit courses.

The summer school program philosophy adopted by the Board states that the District believes:

- 1. Learning is a continuous process in the growth and development of students.
- 2. The summer school program can be a valuable adjunct to, and consistent with, the regular educational experience of students.
- 3. The summer school program can offer unique opportunities not feasible during the traditional school year.
- 4. The summer school program can be valuable for students with special requirements, interests or disabilities.

PROPOSED GOALS

I. Cognitive

- A. Reinforce and improve basic academic skills, including make-up courses.
- B. Promote measurable achievement.
- C. Improve study habits.
- D. Correct learning disabilities.
- E. Minimize learning loss.

II. Affective

- A. Develop and reinforce positive attitudes toward learning.
- B. Provide experiences for students at all achievement levels.
- C. Accommodate immediate needs and interests of learner.

Instruction

III. Teacher/Curriculum

- A. Explore innovative methodologies and encourage creative programming.
- B. Provide alternative environmental experiences.
- C. Promote professional development of teachers.
- D. Provide opportunities for piloting courses.

IV. Community/Parent

- A. Involve parents in the student's learning process.
- B. Promote field study and community experiences.
- C. Promote the utilization of community resources in the school.
- D. Promote use of volunteers of all ages.
