Our February Family Involvement activity will be a Dr. Seuss read-in and birthday party in room 7 from 12:30-1:40 on Friday the 24th. As winter continues, I have noticed there are some friends that are not dressed warmly. We are outside from 7:50-8:00 unless the temperature or wind chill is 10 degrees or more, as well as when the weather cooperates for outdoor recess. Please see me if you are in need of winter gear.

Kindergarten

REPORT CARDS: We have just finished the first half of the school year with a lot of hard work and learning in our kindergarten classrooms. Second quarter report cards will be sent home. Please review your child's progress. If you have any

questions, please send a note to your child's teacher.

PRACTICE AT HOME: The skills learned in kindergarten are the foundation to further learning in the coming years. So it is very important that these new skills are repeatedly practiced at home to help the children build confidence and mastery in each of the area learned. All kindergartners should be reading small three letter words, with the C-V-C format. That is Consonant-Vowel-Consonant, such as cap, mat, fit, dip, etc. Also please continue to memorize sight words and read lots of books at home.

FUN DAYS AHEAD: Some fun things for the children are being planned. February is a short month but it is packed with lots of milestones and holidays. Some include: A day to celebrate our classroom friendships for Valentine's Day, 100th day of school, Groundhog's day, and Presidents Day. Check with your child's teacher for further details about these upcoming events in the classrooms. Mark your calendars and see how you can participate.

FUNDRAISER: We are planning on having a Krispy Kreme fundraiser this month. Your child will receive an order form to take orders and collect payment. The fundraiser will help offset the cost of our spring field trips. More info will be coming soon.

First Grade

Our first graders are starting the new semester with a lot of enthusiasm! Many new skills continue to be introduced, so being on time, good attendance, adequate rest, and proper nutrition are all important. These things are especially important as we are completing MAP testing.

Valentine's Day will soon be here and we will have celebrations in the classroom. Our parties will be on Tuesday, February 14th. More information will be coming home from your child's teacher.

In Math we are finishing Module 7 – Combination of tens in addition. Module 8 will cover addition, subtraction and time. Don't forget to keep practicing addition and subtraction facts. Knowing these will help your child greatly as we continue to explore addition and subtraction. Also, practice skip counting by 2, 5, 10's.

Second Grade

The second grade is taking the winter MAP tests in reading and math the first week of the month. Please make sure your child gets plenty of rest and eats breakfast at school or home. We want every child to do their best on the test.

Please check your child's backpack for a note coming home about classroom Valentine's Day parties. Each classroom will send a note and if you have any questions please call your child's teacher.

The second grade will be taking another field trip to the Golden Rondelle on Wednesday, February 15th. They will see an operatic version of The Three Billy Goats Gruff. Field trip slips have been sent home. Please make sure your child returns the signed form to their teacher.

Make sure your child comes to school dressed for the weather and check to see if they are in need of any school supplies. Thank you for all of your support and please feel free to contact us with any concerns you may have.

Third Grade

You should have received your child's report card, if you have any concerns, please contact your child's teacher.

It is a good idea to continue to practice multiplication and division facts so these are not lost. Flashcards are an easy way to help your child practice these math facts. Rather than buying flashcards, have your child make some.

PLEASE make sure your child is **READING** daily for at least 20 minutes for fluency and comprehension practice. Remember to keep track of reading minutes to earn a FREE ticket to Six Flags Great America. These forms were given out at parent teacher conferences. If your child needs a new form we have them available. It's always nice to receive incentives for things that we are already doing. These reading sheets are due Friday, February 10th. Keep up the reading!

Look for a note from your child's teacher with details on Valentine's Day parties. They will be held on Tuesday, February 14th.

There have been a lot of students who have been displaying disrespectful behaviors towards their adults and peers. Please have a discussion with your child about respect.

Fourth Grade

The fourth graders have many things planned for the month of February. One thing that will be starting is MAP testing for the winter. Please discuss the results with your children and compare their results with the growth score that we shared with you at conferences. Students should show an increase in math and reading.

Another fun activity that we have planned is our Valentine's Day party. We will be planning to have the party on February 14th. Please be watching for party details and a list of students that is soon to come. If you can send treats, please let us know, also.

A final thing to work on is multiplication, place value and fractions. Please remember that there is that needs to be completed by your child and returned the following day. This homework is always a reinforcement of math skills learned in the chapter. Please check your child's assignment book to see if there is a math sheet that day.

Fifth Grade

Happy New Year!! As the New Year has rolled in, we are continuing to be diligent in our work! We are pushing forward for the upcoming MAP TESTING, which will be this upcoming week! Please be sure to eat a good breakfast, get plenty of rest and speak positive words of encouragement as they head to school!

In an effort to help prepare your child for middle school, we have had Starbuck Middle School's principal and counselor come to Giese to assist with scheduling and to answer questions about the transition to middle school. Please look for a schedule that you will need to sign. If your child will not be attending Starbuck they will still fill out the schedule and it will later be transferred to the middle school that they will attend.

Lastly, some students are beginning to misbehave in library, gym, music etc. Please remind your child of appropriate school behaviors no matter where they are in the building. ©

IMPORTANT NOTICE FROM THE ATTENDANCE OFFICE

ATTENDANCE & TARDINESS.....It is very important to notify the office on our attendance phone number at **664-8255** if your child is going to be absent from school. If you do not notify us of your child's absence, we are obligated to call your home.

Wisconsin law allows for **up to 10 days** in a school year to be excused. Beyond this number of absences, medical excuses and/or written requests for absences must be provided and approved.

If your child has a medical reason for an extended absence, written documentation from a doctor is required for the absence to be excused. Any visit to a doctor, dentist, ER, or other health provider may be excused if written documentation is provided to the attendance office. These absences will not be counted toward the 10 days allowed in a school year.

The school day begins promptly at **8:00**. Students who arrive after 8:00 are considered tardy. Please help us begin our school days on time and without disruption from students who arrive late.

If your child is going to be later and needs a hot lunch, please call the main office line at 664-8250 before 3.50 a.m. to order one. Any address and/or phone number changes need to be reported to the main office.


