We just finished up our NWEA MAP assessments in reading and math for all Giese Cheetahs in grades K-5. We had a lot of growth this year.

If your child is in K-2, they will also take their final PALS test. Again, we will encourage your child to do their very best. This data will help us assess your child's strengths and weaknesses and allow us to better focus our instruction so that we can hit the ground running when we return in September.

The next PTA meeting will take place on Tuesday, May 10<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 pm in the Giese Library. Please consider stopping by. We will be discussing topics for the remainder of the year and begin looking at ideas for next year. Volunteers are always welcome!

#### **KINDERGARTEN**

We are having a Mother's Day Concert and Tea starting at 1:30pm in the West Learning Center on Friday, May 6. All moms, grandmas, and aunties are invited to attend. Please send back your RSVP, so we can plan for this special day. We are getting close to the end of the school year but we still have lots of learning to do to be ready for first grade. Please continue to work with your child on learning all the sight words, blending letter/ sound skills, and counting including skip counting by 2s, 5s, 10s. Please spend at least 10-20 minutes a night reading. Work on learning names and values of the coins, too. Finally, work on learning all personal information including birthday, address, and phone number. Our field trip to the Milwaukee zoo is on Friday, June 3. We appreciate all your help supporting our Krispy Kreme fundraiser to help offset some of the cost to attend. Thanks so much to those who have volunteered to chaperone, we will needs lots of chaperones to make this a fun and safe day. Please remember that the weather continues to change from warm to cold and dressing in layers can help. We look forward to seeing the children grow even more this spring.

#### FIRST GRADE

As the school year begins to wrap up please encourage your child to show good behavior and work to the best of their ability. It is important that your child comes to school each day on time. There is so much that we need to teach and that the students need to learn before second grade. We have had a great year, but there is still work to be done.

Our next topics in Math will be data and graphs. We will wrap up the year with fractions and double-digit addition and subtraction.

PALS testing begins Monday, May 2nd through Friday, May13th. Please make sure your child is here on time, well rested and fed on those days. Thank you!

#### SECOND GRADE

MAP testing has been completed. Overall, improvement was shown. PALS testing is next. Remind your child to do his best.

All of the children seemed to enjoy their field trip to the hospital where they were engaged in various interesting activities.

More field trips are coming up. Please check your child's backpack for permission slips and sign and return them as soon as possible.

On May 20, we will be going to the Milwaukee Art Museum. We have received a grant from Kohl's which will cover both the admission and transportation.

On June 1, we will go to the Kansasville Fire Department. This is an all-day event which previous second graders have thoroughly enjoy.

Volunteers are needed for both of these field trips. In order to volunteer, you must be an approved Wings volunteer. Applications forms are available in the office.

In addition to the hospital and Milwaukee Art Museum field trips, we have gone twice to the Golden Rondelle at no cost to the students.

However, each student will have to pay for bus transportation to the fire station. You will be receiving more information about this field trip.

Other events for our students to look forward to are the Smoke House and field day.

We hope that our students appreciate all of the opportunities that are being given to them. The best way for them to show their appreciation is to behave in the classroom and work hard.

#### THIRD GRADE

The end of the year is quickly approaching! It is important that we all work cooperatively to keep the students focused on school and learning. Students should continue to work on basic math facts at home, as well as reading on a daily basis. We will be taking the state Forward Exam the first week of May. Please make sure you encourage your child to exhibit good behavior and work habits as we move toward the end of the school year. Giese's  $10^{\rm th}$  Annual Spelling Bee will be held on May  $27^{\rm th}$ . Details will be sent home. Information about our end of the year field trip will be coming home soon. We will be going to the Racine Gymnastics Center on Friday, June  $3 \rm rd$ .

#### **FOURTH GRADE**

- -Thank you to everyone who ordered carnations for Mother's Day. It's a great fundraiser for our end of the year bowling field trip. The flowers will be given to students to bring home on Friday, May 6<sup>th</sup>. There will be a few extra to buy that day if anyone would like a few more.
- -Reading-Please review the weekly spelling and vocabulary words with your child. These words have been getting more difficult as the year is coming to a close.
- -Science/Social Studies-We will be moving on to the plants chapter in science. We just finished up learning about the 11 eastern United States (chapter 3). In the next couple of weeks, the students will have a 50 states and capitals social studies test. We've been working on this all year. Please keep studying!
- -Math-Keep using Compass Learning to practice your math skills.
- -Look for progress reports to come home soon. Please sign and return them to school.
- -As we get closer to the end of the year field trips and fun activities, please remind your child that behavior needs to continue to be his/her best. We'd like everyone to participate in all the fun events as the year winds down.


Title I Parent Advisory Council - The Council meets only 4 times a year at each meeting childcare and dinner are provided.





## Takeaways:

- Full-day releases are preferred by 72% of families and 59% of staff and 47% of HS students
- Early release/full-day release days should be on Fridays 84% of families, 73% of staff and 77% of students
  - There is support for extending class time for art, music and physical education at the elementary level 55% of families, 61% of staff
- Families repeatedly expressed appreciation for the opportunity to provide their feedback

# **Comments Section Themes - Start and End Time Change Feedback:**

- Transportation and routine would cause families to make adjustments in work and life schedules
- Later end times present a problem during winter months too dark outside
- Potentially could add to the need for daycare & daycare costs
- Later start time for older kids would be positive.


