

Welcome to the April Edition of the 2014-2015 *Cheetah Chatter*. This is probably our busiest month of the year. There are a lot of different activities and events taking place that I want to make you aware of. Your continued support is so important to what we do around here!

We are quickly approaching the end of third quarter, which officially ends on Thursday, April 2nd. Your child's report card will be sent home during the week of April 13th so that you will receive it after Easter Break.

As we enter April, we will be taking the Badger Exam. This test will replace the WKCE that is usually taken in October. This test will incorporate the Math and Reading skill that your students have been working on year long. This test is only for 3rd, 4th and 5th graders. We will begin this test after Spring Break on the week of April 13th. Also, we will finish up our MAP testing at the end of April/early May. This test will show how much growth your child has made during the school year. We know your child(ren) will do their best on both tests

Speaking of the Giese PTA, the next meeting will take place on Tuesday, April 14th at 6:00 pm in the Giese Library. Please consider stopping by to hear of the exciting things planned for the remainder of the year! Volunteers are always welcome!

The next Early Release is scheduled for Friday, April 24th. This will be a two-hour early release and lunch will be served. Your child will be dismissed at 12:45am.

There will be no school on Friday, April 3^{rd.} through April 12th. All students will return to school on Monday, April 13th.

Finally, several parents have asked me about Summer School. Giese will be one of the elementary schools that will be hosting Summer School this year. I strongly encourage everyone to consider enrolling his or her child in this program. Please keep an eye out, as more information will be coming home with your child over the coming weeks.

Continue to practice counting by 1's, 2's, 5's, & 10's. The children should also be working on learning all high frequency words and practicing blending letters to build, read, and spell words. We have several fun events planned for the spring. We will have a special concert at our annual Mother's Day Tea on Friday 5/8. There will be a fieldtrip to the Milwaukee Zoo on Tuesday 5/26. Please note the permission slip, lunch order, and fees are due Friday 4/17. And finally we are tentatively planning a city bus tour the first week of June for each class. Thanks so much for your continued support of our efforts to provide the best education for your child. Enjoy the ever-changing spring weather.

First Grade

It's hard to believe third quarter is almost over and the end of the year is rapidly approaching. There is still a lot of learning to be done, so please encourage your child to stay focused. Spring MAP testing for 1st grade will begin soon. This is the last time your child will take the MAP test this school year. We will also take the PALS test before the end of May. These are very important tests. Please make sure your child is well rested and fed before he or she takes each test.

We are working on the topics of measurement and time in math. In first grade we work on telling time to the hour and half hour. Please remember to keep practicing addition and subtraction facts. Encourage reading and writing at home also. The Racine Public Library is always an excellent resource for finding books your child will enjoy reading.

Please remember to sign and return the lower part of the report card. Look for information to come about summer school.

Second Grade

Grade 2 had a great March! We did a lot of great reading and writing and the whole grade made big, comfortable chairs of our own after reading <u>A Chair For My Mother</u>. Your child should be continuing to practice memorizing their basic facts at home, as well as spending time reading nightly. If you have Internet access, please encourage your child to work on Compass Learning and First In Math.

Master Gardner program visited us recently. Your child should have brought home their terrarium along with instructions for their care. Please continue to send in empty and clear 2 liter bottles for future projects.

Fourth Grade

As we look forward to spring break, we hope to find everyone excited. We hope that everyone returns refreshed and ready to get back to school. We will be having a fundraiser towards the end of April for Mother's Day. The fundraiser will involve students taking orders from other students at school for Mother's Day. We will be selling carnations for Mother's Day, and we will be charging

In math we will be working more with geometry. We will learn the solids, lines, and angles. Please continue working on multiplication and division facts even though we have finished these chapters.


Many students are running low on pencils. Could you please ask your child if they are in need of any additional pencils. If so, please send them.



April is National Autism Awareness Month

The Autism Society has chosen the month of April to celebrate National Autism Awareness. Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) is a complex developmental disability, which consists of certain behaviors that affect each individual differently and to varying degrees. It typically appears in individuals within the first three years of life and affects the person's ability to communicate and interact with others. There is no known single cause of autism. Statistic reports revealed the prevalence of autism is found in 1 of every 68 children in the United States, and almost 1 of 42 boys. Autism is treatable, but never "outgrown." Early identification and interventions can lead to significantly improved outcomes.

A few signs to look for in the children in your life: lack of or delay in spoken language, repetitive use of language and/or motor mannerisms (e.g., hand-flapping, twirling objects), little or no eye contact, lack of interest in peer relationships, lack of spontaneous or make-believe play, and/or persistent fixation on parts of objects. The National Institute of Child Health and Human Development (NICHD) lists five specific behaviors that indicate further evaluation may be necessary: by 12 months: does not babble or coo, gesture, point, wave or grasp; by 16 months: does not say single words; by 24 months: does not say 2-word phrases on his/her own; and at any age has a loss of any language or social skill.

Having these behaviors does not mean your child has autism, but individuals demonstrating these behaviors should be evaluated by a multi-disciplinary team. This team may include a neurologist, psychologist, developmental pediatrician, speech/language therapist, learning consultant, or other professionals knowledgeable about autism.
