Thank you for your time and continued commitment to Giese Elementary...the best kept secret in RUSD!



4 Year Old Kindergarten

We continue to dive into the wonderful world of Dr. Seuss this month. We will share books and do a variety of activities in the classroom, beginning with our Dr. Seuss birthday party on Friday, February 28th. I am looking for Wings approved volunteers to share your favorite Dr. Seuss with the class Monday through Thursday during the month of March. Please see me if you are interested. This is a great time for all families to share these colorful and fun books at home to help reinforce the concept of rhyme.

I have a special request for our Giese community. I am working on a donorschoose.org project the get help promote alphabet awareness and writing in my classroom. I know these materials will help my students learn the alphabet independently and help them be better prepared for kindergarten. Kindergarten

Talk about these topics with your child this month:

<u>Good Attitude</u> — a positive attitude can help your child deal with the challenges of the day. If you haven't heard this before, "Attitude is everything!" Children with good attitudes about their learning and school are very successful and happy. Talk up school and how important it is for your child.

Being Friendly – don't be a bully instead, be a friend. Remind your child to be kind or be quiet. It is difficult in the classroom, lunchroom, playground, etc. when children are choosing unkind ways to treat and talk to each other. Talk up ways to be friendly and how to respond kindly if someone else is not being very nice. It is never OK to fight or fight back at school.

<u>Doing Our Best</u> – Some of the work can be difficult in kindergarten but giving it our best will help us learn. Try to help your child understand that we can't learn and know everything and that practice is necessary to learn new skills. So keep trying and trying and if you did your best, then that is what really counts. Practice at home, working together to complete the homework assigned by your child's teacher.

Being Prepared – start your day off in a good way, bring necessary items to school: book bags, folders, and other notes. Dress appropriately for both inside and outside the classroom. Think about the changing temperatures and

the wet ground on the playground. Consider having a change of clothes in your child's backpack, even an extra pair of socks can be helpful.

Hungry and Sleepyheads — we have many children that are hungry in the morning. Please make sure your child eats before school or comes to school before 7:45 am for our free school breakfast. If your child rides the bus, they should be encouraged to eat breakfast at school if they did not eat at home. Our lunch is not until 11:20 am and it is very hard to concentrate and learn with an empty stomach. A good night of sleep does wonders for a good day in school, too. Thanks for your help in this area.

<u>Thanks to all Giese Families!</u> - We held our kindergarten Field Trip Fundraiser last month, selling Krispy Kreme doughnuts. Yum! We have earned funds to help offset the cost of spring field trips and other activities we are planning for the students.

<u>Talk to your Teacher</u> – if you are having any difficulties and need our assistance, please contact us. Spring conferences are coming, please return requested sign up forms ASAP.

Spring is a great time to really see our Kindergartners blossom in reading and enjoy a little warmer weather. Spring time is coming!

First Grade

It's exciting to watch the first graders use their newly acquired reading skills. Book browsing is a favorite all time activity. The Racine Public Library is a good source of reading materials and a great place for family interaction. Continue reading together every night! If you have access to the internet, working on RAZ Kids is something the kids enjoy. Compass Learning is also great practice for Language Arts and Math!

Memorizing basic addition (+) and subtraction (-) facts are important skills that should be reinforced at home. Practice counting by 5's, and 10's. Our next topic in Math is counting money. Then we will be learning about measurement and then time. All first graders would benefit from some extra practice in these areas.

Second Grade

February has been a busy month for the second graders. In Science, we have all been studying the solar system. Room 24 has constellations on its bulletin board and Room 23's bulletin board features the planets. On Room 21's bulletin board, you can see how the students have used adjectives to describe their drawings.

The students in Room 22 have been learning about the Underground Railroad. Secret codes were often stitched as patterns on quilts to help the slaves travel north. On their bulletin board is a sampler quilt consisting of coded quilt squares. Come inside their room to read what the students have written about their squares.

The Master Gardeners have taken all of the second graders on a journey of a seed. Seeds were planted in a viewfinder and the students are watching them grow. The plants will then be taken home.

Another visitor to the second grade classrooms has been Bailey Bennett, Miss Wisconsin High School. She talked to the students about her Anti-Bullying platform.

Encourage your child to tell you what they have learned in school that day, check on their homework, and listen to them read.

Third Grade

Spring Parent/Teacher Conferences will be held Thursday, March 5^{th(after school)} and Friday, March 6^{th(during the day-NO SCHOOL)}. If your child's teacher is requesting a conference, it is important that you contact his/her teacher.

In February, your child took the NWEA MAP test. Overall, the students showed growth in both reading and math scores from the fall. With your continued support, we hope to see this trend continue as we prepare for the spring tests.

Keep practicing basic addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division facts at home. We continue to take the Fast Fact Friday Timed Tests every Friday. The best way for students to be successful with these is to memorize their facts. Continue to encourage your child to read daily.

Fourth Grade

- -Parent/Teacher conferences are coming up the first week of March. Look for more information coming home with your child.
- -Reading-Please review the weekly spelling and vocabulary words with your child. These words will be getting more difficult and the year continues.
- -Science/Social Studies-We are just finishing up chapter 3 (animals) in science. Next, we will be moving back to social studies. We will be learning about the southern United States (chapter 5).
- -Math-We will be working on fractions for a few weeks (drawing, reducing, equivalent, adding and subtracting, comparing, ordering)
- **Look for progress reports to come home the week of March 2.

By Enrolling Now...

- Your child's schedule and room assignments will be completed.
- Your child's transportation arrangements will be ready.
- You'll avoid long lines on the first day of school.
- You'll ensure that your child gets off to a great start on the first day of school.

How to Enroll

Beginning on Wednesday, March 4, 2015, you may enroll your child at your attendance area school. Be sure to bring proof of address as well as your child's birth certificate and immunization records when enrolling. During the summer months, you may register at the Racine Unified School District Enrollment Center, 3109 Mt. Pleasant St.

Students must be 4 years old on or before Sept. 1 for 4-year-old kindergarten (4K), and students must be 5 years old on or before Sept. 1 for 5-year-old kindergarten (5K).



Magnet Schools

To be eligible for the lottery/waiting list at one of RUSD's elementary magnet schools, you must attend the orientation at the school(s) to which you would like to apply:

Bull Fine Arts (arts magnet school) 815 DeKoven Ave., 262-664-6800 Feb. 19, 2015 at 2 p.m. or 6 p.m.

Jefferson Lighthouse (International Baccalaureate Gifted and Talented Magnet School) 1722 W. Sixth St., 262-664-6900 Feb. 18, 2015 at 2 p.m. or 6 p.m.

Red Apple (science magnet school) 914 St. Patrick St., 262-619-4500 Feb. 17, 2015 at 8 a.m. or 6 p.m.

Otherwise some students (if their dinner was at 5pm) are waiting up to 16 hours to eat again as they wait for lunch at school. Meals with plenty of protein are necessary! Please make sure they are getting enough sleep too. Our students should be sleeping approximately 10-12 hours a night.
