Dear Racine community,

It is with great joy that I present our 2023-24 report to the community as it is such an exciting time to be in the Racine Unified School District. We have great deal of positive news to share through new academic data that demonstrates some exciting progress.

Our district report card is up 2.4 points showing we're headed in the right direction. In fact, congratulations are in order for several schools that increased their scores more than five points:

Case High School increased 11.5 points
Julian Thomas Elementary increased 8.1 points
Olympia Brown Elementary increased 5.1 points
Schulte Elementary increased 8.5 points
Starbuck IB Middle School increased 10.6 points



One of the reasons our report card score increased is due to excellent growth scores in third grade reading. As a district we saw **44% growth in proficiency** - this is double the growth of any other district in the state! I'm also happy to report our graduation rate is increasing.

We're also seeing improved Attendance. So far this school year, students have missed 20,000 fewer days of school. That's a LOT of classroom time and we know it's going to impact student achievement. Thank you for your help in making sure your child is in school every day.

Our community goal is to ensure that students and staff know that we value them showing up every day.

Since 2009, RUSD's graduation rate has climbed by 16.7%, now standing at 83.7%*

#YouBelongHere means that when you walk through our doors that you are valued. Attendance is one of many factors that impact our state report card results, but we know that increasing daily attendance and reducing chronic absenteeism are pivotal in increasing our scores on assessments, improve graduation rates and lead to college and career readiness for our students. Since our attendance and graduation rate are closely linked, we know that a goal of 90% attendance gets us closer to our 5-year strategic plan goal of 86% graduation.

STEAM

RUSD is proud to offer a dedicated STEAM - science, technology, engineering, arts and math - school at Red Apple Elementary. That school will soon be a K-8 in a brand new building opening fall 2025. In addition, the District has dedicated makerspaces in most elementary and K-8 schools, allowing students to think critically, problem solve and get creative. These skills are valuable in any future career!

Early Literacy Initiative

RUSD was ahead of the curve when the District implemented a curriculum aligned to the Science of Reading in the 2021-22 school year. Since then, all principals and teachers have been trained and are able to identify students in need of extra support earlier. The result? The District's early literacy assessments are stronger, there are fewer students in need of intensive interventions and 3rd grade reading Forward exam scores are up significantly.

Advanced Academics

From our K-12 International Baccalaureate (IB) program to our Advanced Placement (AP) offerings, RUSD has several opportunities for college-bound students to take academically challenging courses to earn college credit, saving time and money and stand out to college admissions departments.

Dual Language Program

The Dual Language Program, offered in seven RUSD schools, begins in 4K and students have the opportunity to continue through eighth grade. The program helps students develop language proficiency and literacy in both English and Spanish. Coming soon, RUSD will offer the Seal of Biliteracy at all high schools.

Award Winning Fine Arts Program

RUSD is proud to offer award-winning fine arts programs at the elementary, middle and high school levels. Our offerings include band, Suzuki strings, orchestra, jazz band, marching band, show, swing and madrigal choir, music theory, high voices, low voices, 2D, 3D and mixed media art, drama, plays, musicals and dance.

SEL Programming

Our Social Emotional Learning (SEL) programming is second to none. RUSD is proud to offer seven School-Based Mental Health Clinics in partnership with Children's Wisconsin, dedicated support staff, including social workers, youth advocates and community connectors who are ready to help students in any situation, and daily dedicated time to promote well-being and practice mindfulness.

Advanced Career & Technical Training

Our Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs offer a variety of opportunities for students to enter the workforce after graduation. We are a leader in the state when it comes to giving our students real world experiences. RUSD is roughly 10 percent higher than the state average for students completing dual credit courses and students earning industry recognized credentials. In addition, we have more than 220 students currently in youth apprenticeships and internships.

Our educational offerings are diverse and so is our student body.

RESOURCES

RUSD, like many other school districts across Wisconsin, is facing a major budget shortfall. In fiscal year 2024-25, it's forecast that RUSD will have a \$34 million deficit due to a number of factors, including ESSER (COVID relief) money going away, increased labor costs and decreasing enrollment. However, the biggest reasons for the shortfall are the per pupil aid provided by the state and revenue caps not keeping up with inflation for more than a decade.



How Each Dollar is Spent




Sources of Revenue

During their eighth-grade year, those students will be among the first to experience the new school's makerspaces, fitness center, dedicated tech ed, art, music and business spaces to align with the Middle School Academy model and so much more.





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Starbuck K-8 IB Campus: Opening Fall 2024

RUSD is excited to announce that Starbuck Middle School is being transformed into a K-8 International Baccalaureate (IB) Campus. A brand new elementary addition is being added to the campus to support the K-8 IB continuum, the middle school classrooms are all getting updates and the school is also getting a beautiful, new outdoor recreation space! All students attending this school will take part in the IB Primary Years Programme, which offers a challenging, inquiry-based learning experience, and the IB Middle Years Programme, which continues the challenging curriculum framework, adds exposure to a second language and prepares students for the IB Diploma Programme at Case High School.





Jerstad-Agerholm K-8: Grand Re-opening Fall 2024

When the remodeled Jerstad-Agerholm K-8 opens for the 2024-2025 school year, it will be like a brand new school. The renovated building will include a new elementary gym and commons, new library with devoted makerspace and a new fitness center. No classroom has gone untouched!


Julian Thomas Elementary: Complete!



The Academies of Racine (AoR) are standing out to school districts, superintendents and educators locally, across the state and even nationally. This fall RUSD hosted 30 superintendents from across the country for the Ford Next Generation Learning (Ford NGL) Conference. Ford chose Racine to host so the superintendents, who all oversee schools using the Academy model, could learn more about the District's overwhelming community support, sustainability and more.



RUSD is recognized as one of the leading school districts in dual credit, industry certifications and youth apprenticeship opportunities. The success of the Academies is evidenced by the additional certifications the AoR earned from the National Career Academy Coalition (NCAC) this past year, including two Academies being recognized as Models with Distinction - one of which achieved a perfect score.



Expanding on Success

The high school Academies are also leading the way for the middle School Academies. Now in their second year, the Academies at Jerstad-Agerholm, Mitchell and Gifford K-8 schools are already expanding. With new and updated career and technical course offerings, students have more opportunities to engage in technology that directly aligns to high school and in demand-careers in our community. The Middle School Advisory Council, made up of individuals in the non-profit and service-minded sectors, launched this year to help guide the direction of our middle schoolers' education.
