

4-Year-Old Kindergarten

The 4-year-old kindergarten program is designed for students entering kindergarten in the fall. Each day, students participate in a theme-based activity and just for fun activities designed for the early learner. Young children are eager explorers, so our Summer School activities are designed to ensure children will be actively engaged in exploring their immediate world! *Please note that this a combined session from 7:45 a.m. to 12:35 p.m.*

5K - Grade 8 Courses

All students in 5K through grade 8 will have the opportunity to choose their preference for Summer School programming. When registering, students will be asked to select six courses. From there, students will be scheduled into three of their six preferred Summer School courses. Schedules will be sent out a week before Summer School begins.

Reading Boost: This reading program supports students, giving them that extra boost to develop their literacy skills. By immersing children in language-rich environments designed to facilitate engagement with text, students are able to acquire the necessary skills and concepts to further develop their literacy knowledge.

Math Boost: Our math program is designed to encourage students to develop, test and evaluate as they engage in large and small group activities. This course offers students the opportunity for extra support in math. They will utilize appropriate mathematical strategies throughout each activity and will be actively engaged in collecting, organizing and interpreting data while utilizing higher-level thinking skills.

Improv: This interactive course allows students the opportunity to learn about the world of improv! From plot twists, to changing characters, themes and scenes, students will learn how to make up a story in the moment and put their creativity to the test.

Coding Connection: In this introductory Computer Science course, students will create their own games, art, and digital stories all while developing problem-solving, collaboration, persistence, and computational thinking skills. Students will participate in teacher guided online lessons and well as “unplugged” activities without computers.

Let’s Dance: Let’s Dance! This physical education course allows students to explore a variety of dances and movements from all over the world. From the foxtrot to the tango, your student will learn the art of dance through past and present routines.

Have a Ball: This physical education course offers students the opportunity to get in the game! Students will learn more about sports like basketball and baseball and try their hands at an assortment of different games all involving a ball.

Cardio & Strength Training: The goal of this physical education course is to develop students’ fundamental movement skills within a variety of developmentally appropriate exercises and activities. The program will also enhance students’ personal fitness and provides them the knowledge and skills necessary to engage in a variety of physical activities. Teachers will have the ability to plan their course around materials at the school and basic concepts of aerobics, yoga, and general fitness routines.

Art: Our art course engages the young learner in simple creative activities that are some of the building blocks of child development. Students will be encouraged to express themselves and take risks in creating art and develop a sense of innovation.

Creative Writing: Let your imagination fly! This creative writing course gives students the tools to tell their own stories all while learning and improving their creative writing skills.

Around the World: Around the World will engage students in learning about the geography and cultures of countries around the globe. Students will participate in interactive sessions that explore different culture, geography and people of the world.

Music: This music course encourages students to expand their knowledge of music concepts, artists and genres of music by exposing them to a wide variety of activities. Students will listen and learn music, play instruments and be sure to tap their feet! ***Instrumental Music Lessons*:** Students in grades 4-8 interested in playing their musical instrument (orchestra or band) in instrumental lessons should select music as one of their options and would be pulled out of the music course. No Suzuki method will be offered during the summer programming.

Dual Language Courses

4K Dual Language (for current 4K Dual Language Program Students)

Discover and explore fun, hands-on activities that prepare students for kindergarten. Students will participate in developmentally-appropriate activities to promote literacy, math, science and social emotional development. *Please note that this a combined session from 7:45 a.m. to 12:35 p.m. and only available at Mitchell and Jerstad-Agerholm K-8 Schools and Julian Thomas Elementary School.*

Dual Language Program Students K-8

The Dual Language Summer School program is only available at Mitchell and Jerstad-Agerholm K-8 Schools and Julian Thomas Elementary School. Dual Language Program students will be automatically enrolled in Reading and Math. Dual Language Program families can then choose 3 additional courses from the K-8 course list above. Students must be enrolled in the RUSD Dual Language Program to be eligible for the Dual Language courses.


