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2023-2024 Academies of Racine Horlick High School Profile

Community

Located in southeastern Wisconsin, Racine Unified School District (RUSD) is the fifth largest school district in the state, serving nearly 16,000 students from seven communities, covering 100 square miles. We have (13) Pre K-5 schools, (4) K-8 schools, (2) 6-12 schools, (3) Academy High Schools, and (1) alternative education high school. Our culturally diverse schools prepare our students to thrive in a global community. The student body is culturally diverse with a population that is 27% Hispanic, 25% Black, 41% White and 1% Asian. Sixty-five percent of the students attending RUSD are eligible for free or reduced lunch.

School

The Academies of Racine Horlick High School is an academy public high school for grades 9 – 12. It is accredited by the State of Wisconsin and the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools. The enrollment for 2023–2024 is 1,300+. Administratively, it is divided into four Academies: Freshman Academy, Academy of Business & Culinary Arts, Academy of Education & Technical Services, and the Academy of Health Sciences & Aviation. Students have 4 classes per day on a 90-minute block schedule rotating on an A, B schedule.

Curriculum

There are approximately 200 courses available to students. Courses in the 5 traditional academic areas are sometimes identified as regular, college prep or Advanced Placement. Students also have the opportunity to participate in Business, Family and Consumer Science and Technical Education Work-Study Programs. We offer PLTW courses for college and high school credit.

AP® courses offered: Biology, Chemistry, Calculus, English Literature & Composition, English Language & Composition, US Government & Politics, World History, Microeconomics, US History, Human Geography, Psychology, Spanish Language, AP Research, and AP Seminar.

PACC Course: Education

PLTW® courses offered: Intro to Engineering Design, Principles of Engineering, Digital Electronic Systems, Biomedical Science, Human Body Systems, Biomedical Innovations, Medical Interventions, Engineering Design and Development, and Computer Science Essentials. PLTW is an open-enrollment program.

Additional College Prep (CP) and accelerated classes include: English Usage/Writing, CP Algebra II/ Trigonometry, CP-Geometry, CP Pre-Calculus, Math Studies, Chemistry, Physics, French 3 & 4, Spanish 3 & 4, Music Theory 2-4, and CP Sociology, CP-Biology.

What are the Academies?

The Academies of Racine Horlick are small learning communities that provide real-world experiences with local businesses and professionals, linking schoolwork and the workplace. Each Pathway is a sequence of courses designed to help students prepare for a specific career area while also meeting the mandatory requirements for high school graduation. Regular coursework, including math, language arts, science and history, is presented within the context of the academy's focus. Students also have the same opportunities they have now to select elective courses including Fine Arts and World Language. New to Horlick this year is the American Sign Language (ASL) Cours.

Pathways provide students with a plan to connect coursework in high school with college and career opportunities after graduation. Students choose a pathway in their 9th grade year, and study that area for the next three years. Students have opportunities to earn college credits, experience apprenticeships and earn certifications in a particular field of study.

Grading and Ranking

Class rank is computed for all students at the end of each semester. All grades are considered in class rank, though students have the option of taking 1 credit each year as a pass/no grade. Seniors are able to take 2 credits of pass/no grade. School policy uses a student's unweighted GPA to determine class rank as well as valedictorian and salutatorian. Some courses are not calculated into the GPA and are indicated on the transcript. Beginning with the class of 2020, the valedictorian must be an AP Scholar.
