Dear Giese Families,


Welcome to another edition of the Cheetah Chatter. First, I'd like to thank all who attended our Thanksgiving Dinner and Title One Annual Meeting. Next, we'd like for you to know the dates for winter break. Our last day of this year will be Friday, December 21, 2018. It is a full day of school and students will have an opportunity to participate in the school store and in the holiday parties in their classroom. If you would prefer your child not participate in holiday-themed celebrations or events please let your child's classroom teacher know. Students will return to school Wednesday, January 2, 2019.

A few words about morning arrival. At 7:50 we open the classroom doors. Students are expected to enter through their classroom doors until 8:05. After 8:05 students are tardy and must enter through the front doors. If a parent arrives with a student after 8:05 and wishes to walk to the classroom- the parent must be accompanied by a Giese staff member. Please note, it is extremely difficult for a classroom teacher to conduct even a small conversation with a parent and maintain supervision. The staff member is there to assist with supervision of students should you need to speak with the teacher. Please help us implement this new procedure; it is for the safety of all of our students. In addition, any adult who is in the building during instructional hours must be WINGS approved. Please visit the RUSD website to complete the WINGS application.

Student drop off can be a little hairy in the mornings. In an effort to ensure safety for all students we are asking all parents who drive students to school use the following protocol:

- 1. If you want to walk a student to the classroom doors you <u>must</u> park on the street or in the lot. Do not park in the roundabout.
- 2. If you simply want to drop students off you must use the **Drop Off Lane**. Do not stop and wait in the roundabout. It hinders other parents from being able to drop off their students. If you must get out of your vehicle. PLEASE park in the lot or on the street.
- 3. The Pass Through Lane is ONLY for passing. Do Not drop students off in this lane.
- 4. Buses must pull into the **Drop Off Lane**. Please be mindful of the buses and allow buses to access the **Drop Off Lane**.

The diagram below describes the lanes. Let me know if there are questions.



As you may know, we have been learning and practicing ALICE strategies in an effort to prepare students and staff in the case we ever have the unfortunate experience of a violent intruder. Please ask your student about their knowledge and let us know if you have questions or concerns.

FOUR YEAR OLD KINDERGARTEN

WE ARE GETTING SMARTER - The school year is going fast, we have been in school for more than 50 days. Pre-Kindergarteners are working on learning to write names, numbers, letters, and and draw pictures. We also are starting to hear beginning sounds of words and matching

rhyming words.

WE NEED EXTRA PRACTICE - Things you can do at home to help your child succeed in his or her learning include writing names, writing letters, and numbers. Please remember to use the proper formation; all writing begins at the top, watch how your child is forming letters. It is difficult to break the habit of writing from the bottom, so reinforcement at home is very helpful. The students have learned names for the lines: Skyline, fence line, Grass line, and Worm line. WE CAN READ - Also when reading stories with your child, talk about the story afterwards. Focus on one or more of these details: the setting, characters, telling the beginning, middle, and ending of the story. Then talk about the author and illustrator of the book and what each does. You child "reads" books by memorizing familiar stories or telling the story by looking at the pictures.

WE ARE KEEPING WARM - Just a reminder with the change in seasons, the classrooms at school vary in temperature, so it is a good idea to have multiple layers to take off or put on. Also, please have your child wear hats, mittens, and boots for recess. Children can play in the snow if they have both snowpants and boots. If you need any clothing, please send us a note or call us.

Don't forget to label all your child's belongings. Thanks!

WE NEED YOUR SUPPORT - We will be having a special family engagement activity planned this month. On Thursday, December 20th we will have a Winter Workshop at in the afternoon. So mark you calendars. Information will be coming from your homeroom teachers on how you

can participate, please RSVP.

KINDERGARTEN

Students are well into learning the lowercase letters of the alphabet. Teachers suggest that parents, please practice with your child by asking questions such as: what is this letter? Can you tell me the sound of that letter? Can you tell me a word that starts with that sound? We have now learned half of the alphabet and almost every vowel. Recognizing and practicing the letters and sounds will help your child when we begin to move forward with putting the letters together to spell/read words. We have begun to identify and practice reading tricky words in books, around the classroom, and throughout the school!

We are also exploring numbers by recognizing them and knowing how many each number represents. We are currently focusing on the numbers 0-10. We are diving into where numbers are in a number line using the words: before, after, and beside. We will soon be focusing on measurement and words that describe size.

This Friday, we will be celebrating the last of the fall season with a coloring contest and snack on cider and donuts as a PBIS incentive. Students have also earned time at the Giese Guarantee store using tickets they've earned throughout the school day.

As the year goes on we will continue to learn the rest of the letters in the alphabet and begin to put them together to make words. Students will continue to focus on vowels and consonants in order to work toward reading CVC words. In Math, we will be learning more about numbers so we can begin to learn about adding, measuring, and tracking data.

FIRST GRADE

The first grade teachers would like to send a special thanks to the parents and guardians who took time out of their busy day to discuss their child's progress at parent/teacher conferences. Don't hesitate to contact us if you have additional concerns.

We will be going to the Golden Rondelle on December 3rd. We leave at 9:00 and will return at 10:30. We will be seeing *The Wright Brothers*. This program will focus on science, math, and technology.

Reading several minutes everyday is important for reading comprehension and developing fluency. Keep reading every night with your child.

Keep practicing addition and subtraction facts for memorization. These skills will help your child in math. Also, please practice tying shoes with your child(ren). A lot of them still need practice in order to do this independently, and it would be a great help to the teachers.

As the cold weather approaches, remember that all students in the first grade are outside for fifteen minutes everyday. Please dress your child according to the daily forecast. LABEL EVERYTHING! Sometimes our classrooms can be chilly. It might be helpful to have a sweater or sweatshirt that could be kept at school. When the snow comes an extra pair of socks might also be needed.

Also, as the flu season approaches us please make sure that if your child has a fever to make sure you keep them home. We don't want to spread the flu virus to others. Thank you so much!

SECOND GRADE

We hope everyone enjoyed a great Thanksgiving break with family and friends. Our swimming sessions are going well. The students are learning a lot about water safety. We have 4 sessions left.

We have been working hard here at school and lots of learning is taking place. Please continue to support this learning by having your child read at home daily. To continue to be successful in our upcoming math modules the students will need to be fluent with the addition and subtraction facts. Please continue to have them practice these at home as well. We will be taking our winter MAP tests in a few weeks.

THIRD GRADE

In reading we are learning that when we read mysteries we need to pay attention to the clues to try to solve the mystery before the crime solver does.

In math we will be working on fractions. Please continue to practice basic math facts each night.

Be on the look- out for your child's spelling/Words Their Way sheet coming home. Part of homework is to complete the contract on the back and practice spelling words each night.

Continue to have your child read each night. They can earn a FREE ticket to Six Flags Great America if they read 6 hours between now and the beginning of February.

The cold weather has arrived, please make sure your child has a warm coat, hat, and mittens. It's a good idea to have a sweatshirt in the classroom as well.

FOURTH GRADE

We hope everyone had a great Thanksgiving holiday. We are back for 4 weeks before our next break and have a lot of learning to do.

Math: We just finished a chapter about multiplication and division. Please keep practicing these facts at home as the numbers will get larger as the year progresses. We'll be moving on to fractions until the holiday break. Students get math homework 2-3 times per week. Look over it with your child to help him/her and check for accuracy.

Social Studies: Chapter 5 - We are learning about the western United States. Students need to know the 13 states and capitals of the west as well as vocabulary, main ideas and facts about the west. Test will be Friday, Dec. 7.

Reading/Writing-Please encourage your child to read at home for 10-15 minutes per day, either silently or aloud. Look over work that is sent home to help him/her with writing skills. Many mistakes are being made with previously learned skills like punctuation, capitalization and spelling.

We may also plan a few fun classroom activities before the break. Students need to be on their best behavior to participate in these activities. We know this time is exciting for our students but we still have learning to do.

When did you decide you wanted to be a counselor?
