CLASSROOM NEWS

4-K-Mrs. Balestrieri Rm 7; Mrs. Wamboldtt Rm 8

We have just finished the first half of the school year with a lot of hard work and learning in our 4-year old kindergarten classrooms. We also have finished the Mid-Year PALS test and results will be sent home. The second checkpoint report cards will be sent home after 2/18/19. If you have any questions, please send a note to your child's teacher. FAMILY TIMES: The biggest gift you can give your child is the gift of reading. There is so much learning that happens when you read to and with your child. FUN DAYS AHEAD: Friendships and Kindness are celebrated during this month. Check with your child's teacher for further details about how you can participate. FUNDRAISER: We are planning on having a Krispy Kreme fundraiser this month. Your child will receive an order form to take orders and collect payment. The fundraiser will help offset the cost of our spring field trip to Green Meadows Farm. More info will be coming soon.

KINDERGARTEN- Ms. Snorek Rm 16; Miss. Schmitt Rm 17; Miss. LayDel-Moral Rm 18 Now that we have learned the upper- and lower- case letters and the letter sound associated with the letters, we will continue to practice these skills and practice using the sounds together to make words. We will also begin to learn how silent "e" changes our vowel sounds to say their name and practice spelling words. We will begin to learn about the diagraphs: ch, th, wh, sh, & ck. We will learn their sounds and how we can use them in words like: chin, thumb, whistle, ship, & sock. We will probably celebrate our 100th Day of School on February 11. This is a special day to us because every day, we practice counting up to the number of days of school we have had so far. On our 100th Day of School we will celebrate by counting to 100 with 1's, 5's & 10's. Even after the 100th Day of School occurs, we continue to practice counting. Please help us practice when at home or riding in a vehicle. During Science, we've been learning about the earth. We recently had a discussion to look and discuss different types of rocks. We also talked about how the earth gets changed due to water, air, and fire (like due to a volcano).

FIRST GRADE-Mrs. Ferguson Rm 19; Mrs. Johnson Rm 20

Our first graders are starting the new semester with a lot of enthusiasm! Many new skills continue to be introduced, so being on time, good attendance, adequate rest, and proper nutrition are all important. Our next district field trip is Tuesday, February 5th. We will be going to the Kenosha Public Museum. If you would like to chaperone you need to be WINGS approved. Valentine's Day will be here soon and we will have celebrations in the classroom. More information will be coming home from your child's teacher. In Math we are beginning Module 7 — Combination of tens in addition. Module 8 will cover addition, subtraction and time. Don't forget to keep practicing addition and subtraction facts. Knowing these will help your child greatly as we continue to explore addition and subtraction. Also, practice skip counting by 2, 5, 10's. Keep reading every night with your child. Talk with them about their book. Have them tell you what happens in the beginning, middle and end of the story.

SECOND GRADE-Mrs. McKnight Rm 22; Mrs. Martinez Rm 23

It's hard to believe that we are half way through the school year. We have completed our winter NWEA MAP testing. Many of the students were able to show a lot of growth in reading and/or math. We will continue to work hard on reaching our end of the school year growth goals. Please continue to encourage your child at home as we continue in our learning. It is very vital that the students are spending time outside of school reading and working on their math facts. If you do not have books available at home, please let us know. The Six Flags Read to Succeed form is due on the 14th. If you need another copy, please let your child's teacher know. As we continue to experience extreme temperatures, please remind your child to wear his/her hats, scarves, and gloves. If your child needs any of these items, please let the school know.

THIRD GRADE-Mrs. Underkofler Rm 34; Mrs. Walquist Rm 35

Testing: MAP testing has been completed for winter. Forward Exam will begin at the end of March. The Forward Exam is for 3rd -5th graders. **Reading:** We will be finishing up our Character Studies Unit and begin our Assessment Preparation Unit to get students ready for the Forward Exam. **Writing:** We will be finishing up our Informational writing unit, move on to a small unit about writing an essay, and then work on practicing constructed responses in preparation for the Forward Exam. **Math:** We just finished Module 6 and are working on Module 7. During Module 7 we will be extending the 10s multiplication facts, working on the 9s, 8s, 1s, and 0s multiplications facts, working with picture graphs, bar graphs, and line plots. **Field trip:** Room 35 will be going to the Racine Zoo.

FOURTH GRADE-Mrs. Lewno Rm 36; Mrs. Hays Rm 37

January has come and gone, and our fourth graders have been hard at work. They've been learning the states and capitals of the southern United States in social studies. The test will be mid-February. In the upcoming weeks, they will continue working on multiplication and division but at a higher level by incorporating these skills with two, and three, digit numbers. Please practice basic facts at home to help with this. Math homework is sent home Tuesday and Thursday. Ask your child for this and help if needed. Thanks. Don't forget to fill out the Six Flags Great America sheet to receive a free ticket. After your child reads for six hours, bring the signed sheet back to school. He/she will get the ticket at the end of the school year.

Winter MAP testing has been completed. Please ask your child about his/her scores and goals. Their score/goal sheets were sent home last week. Watch for information about a Valentine's Day party in February. Always feel free to contact us with any questions or concerns. Class Dojo is probably the quickest and easiest way for contact.

We have completed MAP testing and are beginning to prepare for the state Forward Exam. Please encourage your child to practice skills and read nightly.
