

When the new year begins we will recap our PBIS expectations (Be Respectful, Be Responsible, Be Safe). This strategy helps us maintain a safe environment conducive to learning. Ask your Cheetah about PBIS.

We just finished our winter MAP test sessions. We saw some really good growth and hope that students are able to maintain and continue to grow academically. The MAP test measures growth from the Fall MAP Testing Session and it also gives us a district wide comparison. If you ever have questions about testing please don't hesitate to ask.

As the Wisconsin weather begins to rev up, we'd like for parents to keep two things in mind:

- Students need to be dressed for the weather. All students go out to recess daily when the temperature is above 11 degrees. We can not LEGALLY allow them to remain inside because it is cold; we are bound to take them outdoors. Dress Appropriately.

<u>CLASSROOMS</u>

4-K-Mrs. Hays Rm 7; Mrs. Wamboldt Rm 8

MRS. HAYS – is on maternity leave. Ms. Scales will be here for her.

LEARNING: The children in 4-year-old kindergarten have worked hard learning many new skills in school learning to write names, read letters and numbers, and work out problems with others. We enjoy seeing them have proud moments when they learn something new and try something difficult. Your efforts to make school important to you and your child shows in their positive attitude toward their learning and behavior. Continue to practice at home.

THANK YOU: A big thanks to all the families who joined us for our WINTER WORKSHOP. We appreciated and enjoyed having the extra adult help to make the day a success. Hope you enjoyed the extra time to see your child at school. An extra special thank you to the families who donated materials for all our fun and brought cookies to enjoy!

WEATHER: Just a reminder to label your child's belongings, especially since we get lots of clothing that is similar (i.e. black gloves, black hats, black snow pants, etc.) In the classroom, the temperature fluctuates, so multiple layers to put on or take off help make the day comfortable. Also, during the winter months we have recess daily if the temperature and/ or wind chill is higher than 10 degrees. Recess is about 15-20 minutes, so please make sure your child is prepared with boots and snow pants, especially when the snow is on the ground. Also, a change of clothes including socks in your child's backpack can be helpful if your child has an accident. FAMILY FUN DAY: Mark your calendars and come with your child on Friday, January 31 at 9am for a fun snowman day. Hopefully, we won't be snowed out like in past years! KINDERGARTEN- Ms. Snorek Rm 16; Miss. Schmitt Rm 17

We have learned the entire lower-case alphabet, but we really need to practice our letter sounds and how to write them. We will be practicing blending (putting the sounds together) Please help us review at home. We will begin to learn the upper-case letters next. We will learn them quite quickly. Each day, we will learn 2-3 uppercase letters. For Writing, we are learning that the skills we have learned in Reading are the same skills we need to use for Writing. We need to know our letter sounds, punctuation, snap words, and picture powers. We have been learning a lot about numbers. We now know how to print the numbers 0-10. We can also count objects to show the number. We are beginning to learn how to add.

FIRST GRADE- Mrs. Gupta Rm 18; Mrs. Ferguson Rm 19; Ms. Kossman Rm 20 More than 40 years of research demonstrates that parent engagement may close the student achievement gap. We welcome your active participation in reviewing spelling lists, high-frequency words, and encouraging your children to read for a minimum of 15 minutes per night. Raz Kids also offers children an opportunity to listen as books are read to them. Children are currently analyzing informational texts and learning to find the main idea or big idea, as well as supporting details. They are writing "All About" books to share their information about something they know about, whether that be recess, animals, or another topic of their choosing. They pull details from their own lives or from classroom resources. First Graders continue to build their knowledge of addition and subtraction strategies up to 20. Children are learning about the holidays and sharing how they spend their holidays during morning meeting.

Next month's character trait focuses on citizenship and what it means to be a good citizen. How do we care for our community and show that we care for our community? How do protect members of our community? How do we support our community? How do we support our country and our planet as citizens of the world? Please ask your children about what they're learning and support their growth in all areas.

SECOND GRADE-Mrs. McKnight Rm 22; Mrs. Martinez Rm 23

We have **completed our winter NWEA MAP testing** for reading and math! The students' showed **growth in both areas**. We want to keep the momentum going for the second half of the school year. Please continue to help your child by **encouraging them to read daily** and by talking to them about what they are reading. As we continue in our Origio Math modules it will be crucial that the students **know their math facts**. Please continue to use the **flash cards given out at parent-teacher conferences** to help the students memorize their facts. Continue to **reinforce positive school behaviors** with your child, as we will continue focusing on these skills at school. We hope everyone enjoys a relaxing Holiday season with family and friends.

THIRD GRADE-Mrs. Underkofler Rm 34; Mrs. Walquist Rm 35

In reading we are working on learning how to **read non-fiction books**. We are also, working on **informational writing**.

In math we will be working on x9, division with 8's, 1's, 0's and, graphing. Please continue to practice basic math facts each night.

Continue to have your child read each night. They can earn a FREE ticket to Six Flags Great America if they read 6 hours between now and the beginning of February. A paper will be coming home shortly.

The cold weather has arrived, please make sure your child has a warm coat, hat, and mittens. It's a good idea to have a sweatshirt in the classroom as well.

Most **head lice** are spread by direct head to head contact, for example; during play, slumber parties, or sports activities. Less often lice are spread during the school day.

Per RUSD Protocol/Policy under the direction from DPI, the American Academy of Pediatrics and the Center for Disease Control and Prevention guidelines, students identified with live head lice at school do not need to be sent home early from school. If a parent desires to sign out their child early, this will be an excused absence. The child's parent or guardian will be notified that day by telephone and/or a note sent home with their child stating that prompt, proper treatment of this condition is in the best interest of their child and his/her classmates. The parent/guardian is to complete the bottom portion of the note and return this to school the next day verifying that appropriate treatment has been completed. Students identified with head lice should be discouraged from close direct contact with others. The student may return to school immediately following treatment, however, must be checked by trained school staff before returning to class. They will be monitored for signs of re-infestation. If there is more than one child with live lice identified in a classroom, a letter will be sent home to the parents of the children in the affected classroom recommending that they check their children for any evidence of head lice. As school health service staff, we want to provide you with information you may need and support you and your family. Head lice can only be eradicated with parent/guardian involvement. There are necessary steps that must take place in the home. We appreciate how difficult it can be to get rid of head lice in a household. It is a difficult responsibility for you, and we are here to offer our support.
