Dear Giese Families,

Fall Conferences are coming soon. If you have not yet set a time with your child's teacher please do so as soon as . We can't wait to tell you all of the wonderful things we've learned together thus far.

Changing Weather The weather outside is a'changing! Please dress students in layers and with proper gear for outdoor play (Gloves, Hats, Scarves, and Snow pants when necessary). If you are in need of a coat or other winter gear please let our School Social Worker, Mrs. Podskarbi or our School Counselor, Mrs. Howard know.

Meds At School - With so many changes in weather, it is inevitable that students will get sick this season. Please note ALL medications (including throat lozenges) must follow the RUSD Policy Protocol for Meds at School. Please speak with Nurse Jordan if your child will need any medication administered throughout the day. Students will not be allowed to self medicate.

Next Week 'Daylight Savings' ends. This means time will move back an hour. It is important to know that this may effect your child's sleeping pattern. Fortunately, this is pretty easy to address. Move your child's sleep period later by 30 minutes for three days before the time changes. When we change to the new time this will effectively move their sleep period an hour later. In this example, you will have your child go to sleep at 8:30 PM to 6:30 AM for three days before falling back. Then move them back to the old schedule at new time (8 PM to 6 AM). This approach will hopefully cushion the landing from "falling back" and help you get a little more shuteye.

FOUR YEAR OLD KINDERGARTEN

LOTS OF FUN: October was a busy month in our 4K rooms. We enjoyed meeting families at the Pumpkin Farm for our first Family Engagement Day. We had our Character Parade to the Nursing home and enjoyed spreading a little cheer to the residents in our fun costumes.

LOTS OF LEARNING: We have been learning many letter, working on reading our names, listening for sounds letters make, and rhyming fun.

LOTS OF CLOTHING: We hope you are enjoying the change of seasons, just a reminder to please dress your child for the weather especially for being outside for the daily recess. It is also helpful to have an extra sweatshirt to put on or take off in the classroom as the temperatures change inside, too. Also make sure to mark your child's belongings so we can help keep the right pieces with the right kids. Lots of black hats. Thanks! LOTS OF TESTING: During the month, all 4K students participated in the PALS literacy screening. First term report cards will be available at Parent Teacher Conferences on Nov. 8 and Nov. 9.

LOTS OF PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES: Conferences are scheduled and a reminder note was sent home. Please contact your child's teacher immediately if the time/ day does not work. Thanks for your cooperation. We look forward to meeting with you at the Parent-Teacher conferences.

KINDERGARTEN

We have been working really hard in third grade. Please continue to work on reading for at least 20 minutes and basic math facts for at least 20 minutes every day at home. In reading we have started our Mystery Unit. We are learning that when we read a mystery we should ask "What's the mystery here?" and "Who is the crime solver?". We also need to pay attention to clues, try to predict what will happen, and think about how stories tend to go and use that information to learn how mysteries usually go. In math we have started to learn some strategies to figure out multiplication facts. We have learned how to figure out 2s and 4s multiplication facts. We are going to start working with telling time. Telling time to the nearest minute on an analog (face) clock and being able to tell how many minutes past the hour or until the next hour. Parent/Teacher Conferences will be held on November 8th and 9th there is no school on either of those days. Reminders will be sent home. Please contact us as soon as possible if you have not sent in times that work with your schedule.

FIRST GRADE

The first graders have been very busy this fall. The children have been working on place value and making numbers with tens and ones. Extra practice using manipulatives (ex. cereal, raisins, buttons, marbles, and crayons) will be a great help. Have your child put the objects into groups of tens and then some ones. Have them tell you the number and how many tens are in the number and how many ones. Our next lessons will be on telling time.

We're thrilled to notice the children's excitement over learning to read. Make sure they are reading at their level. We would like to encourage the use of the downtown library as a source of reading materials. Most children love having their own library card. Colder weather is upon us. Please remember to label ALL of you child's outerwear (coats, snow pants, hats, gloves, mittens, scarves). Your child may also keep a sweater or sweatshirt here at school to put on if they feel cold.

We're looking forward to seeing everyone on November 8 or 9 for conferences.

SECOND GRADE

We are approaching the end of the first quarter of the school year. We have been working hard implementing our Writer's Workshop and pressing forward with Reader's Workshop and Origo math. Please continue to encourage your child daily to read to you at home and practice the math facts.

We will begin our 6 weeks of swimming lessons on Thursday, November 15th. Please remember to send your child's swimsuit and towel. If you haven't already, make sure that your child's permission slip is turned in. You are welcome to join us as long as you are WINGS approved.

If you have not already signed up for a parent-teacher conference please notify your child's teacher so that an appointment can be scheduled.

THIRD GRADE

We have been working really hard in third grade. Please continue to work on reading for at least 20 minutes and basic math facts for at least 20 minutes every day at home. In reading we have started our Mystery Unit. We are learning that when we read a mystery we should ask "What's the mystery here?" and "Who is the crime solver?". In social studies, we'll be studying chapter 5, which is the states of the western United States. The students will need to know the states and capitals as well as topics like geography, people and places of the west.

Continue encouraging your child to read aloud at home. This helps with fluency and comprehension skills



- Log in to the Infinite Campus Parent Portal
- · On the left-hand side of the screen click "Grades." This will give you a summary for all classes your child is enrolled in.
- · In-Progress grades will show up in yellow, while Final grades will show up in green
- · Click the course name to get more details about assignments, due dates and comments.


