Synchronous learning for K5-5th grade starts at 8:00 am and ends at 1:40. Synchronous Learning is live learning with the teacher. The expectation is that all students are present for learning during this time. If they are not present they will be marked absent. Unexcused absences are considered truancies. Don't be TRUANT! Parents, I urge you to make a schedule which includes a bedtime with adequate sleeping time. You'll want to add an alarm so that students can wake up with enough time to get dressed, eat breakfast and prepare for learning. Students should not be having breakfast during the instructional time and they should be dressed appropriately; no PJ's unless we are having a spirit day or a PBIS celebration. Your schedules should also include time for Asynchronous learning. This is the time between 1:40 and 3:00. During this time students are expected to continue the learning independently. We know you are all doing your very best to make the most of this unfortunate time in our world. We welcome any questions you may have for us regarding supporting your learners. The best time to ask would be during our Parent Teacher Conferences Monday from 11:00am to 7:00pm and Tuesday from 7:00 am to 2:00pm. 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## KINDERGARTEN - Ms. Snorek Rm 16; Ms Schmitt Rm 17; Ms. Mielke Rm 18

Now that we are using the tablet devices, we are meeting daily. It is important that your child is participating with the class or doing the make up work so your child will be prepared for first grade. Your child may need some assistance in navigating their tablet at first. We encourage you to have your child take over navigating more and more each time. The Kindergartner should be able to locate RAZ Kids, IXL, See Saw, as well as getting into Google Classroom as time progresses. Some Kindergartners will grasp it faster than others depending on their experiences with other electronic devices.

For Language Arts: We are currently learning about the letters in the alphabet. We are learning how to write the letters. We are also learning about the sounds generally connected to the letters, and how to place these sounds together to create words.

For Math: We are focusing on how the numbers are in a sequential order. It is important that we can write the numbers, understand the quantity each number represents and how they work with one another so we can be prepared to add and subtract.

Each month, we are focusing on explaining one of our grading standards. This month, the standard is from Math, known as K.CC. 3 - Write numbers from 0-20. Represent a number of objects with a written numeral 0-20 (with 0 representing a count of no objects). This means the students are learning how to properly write numbers and can show how many objects are in a given set. This is a foundational skill to prepare the students to add and subtract.

First Grade Learns and Shows Gratitude This Month!

The school year is off to an incredible start! Students are reviewing letter sounds and moving toward blending more challenging words. In Reader's Workshop, we are establishing reading habits to become avid readers, and building upon grammar rules learned in Kindergarten while building vocabulary. In math, we've begun our module on time and measurement, while continuing to practice addition and subtraction math facts.
Children can use online math and reading websites at their leisure.

## Morning Meeting

Did you know Morning Meeting is an important part of your child's day? Morning meeting is a fun, effective and research-based tool used to build class and school community through activities and sharing. Children learn to build healthy relationships with others while strengthening character traits (respect, grit, gratitude, courage, kindness, compassion, honesty, loyalty... and so much more).
This month, we've been discussing gratitude. What is gratitude? What are we grateful for? How can we show gratitude? What can we do when someone shows gratitude for something we do? Who are you grateful for?
Please have your child logged in by 8am so they may participate in Morning Meeting.
