Dear Giese Families,

Can you believe it's already October? The air is getting brisk, so please ensure students have on layers with the shift in temps, kids can quickly become too cool or too warm. I want to thank you all so much for the warm reception I have received from the Giese Families. Please join us next Friday, October 5th for an Ice Cream Social/Meet and Greet so that I may meet you and share some things with you about me and my vision for an awesome school year.

We've just finished the first round of NWEA MAP Tests. These tests, taken 3 times a year help us know more about what your child has learned this far in or her academic career and where we need to go to maximize their academic growth.

One sure fire way to help at home is to Read, Read, Read. Did you know that reading more strengthens your brain, improves concentration, and helps children achieve better in school.

Many families have asked about Birthday Treats and other food related queries. Here's a quick breakdown: Students may bring a birthday treat which will be shared at the end of the day. You are encouraged to bring healthy snacks, which are individually wrapped, no homemade treats are allowed. Also, if students receive a school provided hot lunch they may not bring additional snacks or desserts (Doritos or twinkies for example). Students may also choose to bring a cold lunch to eat during the lunch period. The contents of the lunch is at the parent's discretion. ### FOUR YEAR OLD KINDERGARTEN

RULE TIME: The children are learning new rules for school. We are reminded from Busy Bee to "be Safe and be Kind." We also will be learning how to solve problems using solution cards and a technique or friend Tucker Turtle will teach us. Our school wide PBIS rules are "be respectful,

be responsible, be safe, and be kind."

LEARNING TIME: Children are also getting use to a schedule full of learning, fun, and friendship. We are working on how to take turns, share, be good listeners, and get along with each other. We also want to stress a learning attitude saying "I Think I Can, I Think I Can" (or at least I can try.) The best way to learn is to try and experiment and try again and again. In the month we will begin our PALS Literacy Screening. Once completed we will send you results. WEATHER TIME: Wisconsin weather is constantly changing. Just a reminder to please dress your child for the weather especially for being outside for the daily 15 minute recess. It is also helpful to have an extra sweatshirt to put on or take off in the classroom as the temperatures change inside, too.

FUN TIMES: October is a busy month with the change of season and harvest time. We will have a Fire Prevention week. Also, all 4 year old kindergartners and their families are invited to join us at Borzynski's Pumpkin Farm. RSVPs and Fees are due 10/4/18. Just a reminder Volunteers or Chaperones must be WINGS approved to attend (apply on-line.) Near the end of the month we will have a Costume Parade and Party in our homerooms and volunteers are welcome to

join in on the fun.

FAMILY TIMES: Thank you to all the families for sharing the evening with us at open house. It was a pleasure to meet you and share our excitement about teaching your child. Conferences will be coming up in November, more information will be sent home by your homeroom teacher during the month to select a conference time. Also, please complete ASQ questionnaires passed out at Parent Orientation. We are off to a great start. If you have any questions, please let us know. Thanks so much for your wonderful family involvement.

#### KINDERGARTEN

Rule Time: We have been having a lot of fun in kindergarten making friends and spending time together building positive relationships. We also have been very busy learning and practicing all the new rules at school. It is not easy remembering to raise our hand if we have something we want to share and walking in a straight line. These are things that we are continuing to practice daily so we can get better at it. We have been having so much fun learning new songs and playing games that encourage communication, taking turns, and positive interactions with one another. Please continue to talk with your child about the importance of following our rules at school so we can have a safe, happy, and successful school year together.

**Learning Time-** We have been working hard on strengthening our fine motor skills by practicing how to write our names daily. We also have been working on writing the letters t, b, and f. We have been talking about the writing rules and working hard on writing our letters on the correct lines. We encourage your child to practice writing their names and letters the correct way daily at home to reinforce what they have been working on in school.

**Fun Times**- We have a field trip to the Pumpkin Farm and River Bend that will be coming up soon so watch for information that will be sent home about that. We also will be having a costume parade and party towards the end of the month.

We are off to a great start! Thanks so much to all the amazing families that attended open house it was so great to see you there. We appreciate all your help and support! If you have any questions or concerns don't be afraid to speak with us. Thank you!

#### FIRST GRADE

We would like to thank all the families who came to Open House.

Please continue to practice Kindergarten sight words. There are 37 Kindergarten sight words in all. Watch for new words to come home throughout the year. All students should be able to read these words without sounding them out. Read with your child daily.

Our Math series is Origo. We have finished Module One. Module Two will teach our students how to use different math strategies to add. It will also give an introduction to measuring with non-standard unit. Please practice basic addition and subtraction math facts. Flash cards would be beneficial.

Please go online and fill out your WINGS volunteer forms if you plan on being a chaperone or working as a volunteer in our classrooms or school this year. It can take a while to get approved so get it in ASAP. Our first field trip is October 3rd. We will go to Hawthorne Hollow. We leave at 8:45 and return around 11:30. We will be outside so please dress accordingly.

Please, check with your child or their teacher for any school supplies that your child may be missing. Send any missing supplies to school as soon as possible. If you have not gone to the Parent Portal to fill out your emergency information, please do so.

#### SECOND GRADE

It's hard to believe that the first month of school is over! We have completed our MAP tests and are beginning to set goals for learning growth. All 2<sup>nd</sup> grade students will be going to the YMCA for six weeks of swimming lessons starting on Thursday November 15<sup>th</sup>. These lessons will focus on water safety. Your child will need to bring a swimsuit and towel. Permission slips will be coming home in the next couple of weeks.

We are setting our classroom rules and expectations in place. Please support us by reinforcing the importance of following rules and being respectful at school. Both second grade classrooms are using ClassDojo. This is a classroom management tool that makes it easy to communicate with families. The log-in information was sent home with each student. Please take some time to set up your account so that you can be informed of how your child is doing in school each day. We are looking forward to a great year of learning!

#### THIRD GRADE

Third grade is off to a great start. Your child's success in third grade depends on reinforcement work at home. Helping your child at home will be very beneficial to his/her success. Your child should be reading and practicing math facts at home nightly. This is in addition to any other homework that may be sent home.

Please check to see if your child has a working pair of headphones at school. We use the computers every day so it is very important to have working headphones (or earbuds if your child prefers).

As a school we are working on a PBIS (Positive Behavior Intervention Strategies) skill of the month. September's skill is "respect". Some of the students have been having some difficulty in this area. Please help us by reinforcing the importance of being respectful at all times.

Keep an eye out for a letter to come home about our Halloween party. Please feel free to contact us with questions and/or concerns.

#### **FOURTH GRADE**

September has come to a close already. We've been hard at work. We finished chapter 1 in math which dealt with place value. We'll be moving on to addition and subtraction strategies. We're coming to the end of social studies chapter 7 which is the Midwest. Students are learning about the people, places states, and capitals of the 12 Midwestern states. Test will be Tuesday, Oct 2. We will then moving on to science for the month of October. Our reading stamina is up to 15 minutes without stopping. Writing stamina has been building but we still have work to do. Please encourage your children to read and/or write 15-20 minutes per day to improve skills.

Parents/guardians, if you haven't already, could you please give us your email address so we can connect with you via Class Dojo? We use it for daily behavior points as well as sending messages about upcoming events or other important information.

#### FIFTH GRADE

Fifth grade is off to a fabulous start! We took our first field trip to the Racine Food Bank where we learned about community food programs and the need to help others. A follow up lesson will take place at school the first week of October. We will also take a second field trip to the Golden Rondelle on October 2<sup>nd</sup>. There we will learn about technology. This trip is a donation from Johnson's Wax.

MAP testing is complete. We will be using those results to differentiate our instruction. Please encourage your child to continue to strive to do their best daily.

At the end of the month information regarding Halloween/Fall celebrations will come home. Watch for that!

Students are still in need of head phones or ear buds. Please ask your child if they have them. Thank you for your support. WE appreciate all that you do!
