Dear Giese Families,

Can you believe it's already October? The air is getting brisk. Leaves are starting to change colors but it seems like summer too.. so many shifts. Please ensure students have on layers with the shift in temps, kids can quickly become too cool or too warm. Before we get to far into the chatter, we are seeking parents to be a part of our leadership team. We meet once a month and we need to have your input. Please see Ms. King if you are interested.

We've just finished the first round of NWEA/MAP Tests. These tests, taken 3 times a year, help us know more about what your child has learned in his or her academic career and what will maximize their academic growth. One sure fire way to help at home is to Read, Read. Did you know that reading more strengthens your brain, improves concentration, and helps children achieve better in school.

We often get questions about Birthday Treats and other food related questions. Here's a quick breakdown: Students may bring a birthday treat which will be shared at the end of the day. You are encouraged to bring healthy snacks, which are individually wrapped, no homemade treats are allowed. Also, if students receive a school provided hot lunch they may not bring additional snacks or desserts (Doritos or twinkies for example). Students may also choose to bring a cold lunch to eat during the lunch period. The contents of the lunch is at the parent's discretion. If there are more questions or concerns please feel free to ask me.

We practice PBIS at Giese. It is our way of addressing behavior in a positive manner. It is incentive based and will show up just about everywhere at Giese. From Dojo points to morning meeting to the signage in the halls reminding students of the expectations, PBIS is how we do what we do at Giese. Students are recognized for their good behavior in a variety of ways. Here are a few: Monthly Incentives, PBIS store, PAWS rewards, H"A"Y Day,Treasure Box Treats, and so much more. Ask your child's teacher about DOJO. The Character Dress up Parade is one of our incentives. On Thursday, October 31, 2019. Students who've earned it may dress up as their favorite characters. Please refrain from gruesome (blood,weapons, etc.) costumes and face masks will not be allowed. We will parade West on Byrd Avenue down to the nursing home and head back East on Byrd to the school. Please come see all of our many characters. The Parade begins at 1:00 pm.

We have been closely monitoring our Pick up and Drop Off procedures. Parents, for the safety of the children please refrain dropping students off in the middle of the street. Also, please remember parking in the lot is reserved for staff. Please note: Students who are being picked up for an early dismissal will need to be picked up by 2:35. We will continue to unite students and parents in cases of emergency which occur past 2:35.

Lastly, we have begun learning about ALiCE at Giese and we will practice what to do in the case of an armed intruder. CLASSROOMS

RULE TIME: The children are learning new rules for school. We are reminded from Busy Bee to "be Safe and be Kind." We also will be learning how to solve problems using solution cards and a technique or friend Tucker Turtle will teach us. Our school wide PBIS rules are "be respectful, be responsible, be safe, and be kind."

LEARNING TIME: Children are also getting use to a schedule full of learning, fun, and friendship. We are working on how to take turns, share, be good listeners, and get along with each other. We also want to stress a learning attitude saying "I Think I Can, I Think I Can" (or at least I can try.) The best way to learn is to try and experiment and try again and again. In the month we will begin our PALS Literacy Screening. Once completed we will send you results. **WEATHER TIME:** Just a reminder to please dress your child for the weather. Our class has a daily 15 minute, outside recess. It is also helpful to have an extra sweatshirt for chilly days in the classroom.

FUN TIMES: October is a busy month with the change of season and harvest time. We will have a Fire Prevention week. Also, all 4-year old kindergartners and their families are invited to meet us at Borzynski Pumpkin Farm. RSVPs and Fees are due by Thursday 10/10/19. Near the end of the month we will have a Costume Parade and Party in our homerooms and volunteers are welcome to join in on the fun. This has been a very busy month in Kindergarten! We have learned about the following characters: Tucker Turtle, Bumble Bee, Echo and Baby Echo. Ask your child to tell you about these special friends. These characters have helped us teach valuable lessons to your child. We have been working very hard at learning to read. At the moment, our reading is primarily looking at the pictures and telling a story about them. We will be working our letters and sounds for the first part of the year, please practice these sounds with your child.

Please continue to **practice Kindergarten sight words**. There are 37 Kindergarten sight words in all. Watch for new words to come home throughout the year. All students should be able to read these words without sounding them out. Read with your child daily.

Our Math series is Origo. We have finished Module One. Please review the math worksheets that come home with your child. Please practice basic addition and subtraction math facts. Flash cards would be beneficial.

Please go online and fill out your **WINGS volunteer forms** if you plan on being a chaperone or working as a volunteer in our classrooms or school this year. It can take a while to get approved so get it in ASAP. Our first fieldtrip is October 1th.

Please, check with your child or their teacher for any school supplies that your child may be missing. **Send any missing supplies to school as soon as possible**. If you have not gone to the Parent Portal to fill out your emergency information, please do so.

RACINE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT ANNUAL ASBESTOS NOTIFICATION 2019-2020 School Year Under AHERA (Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act), all primary and secondary schools are required to develop and implement a plan for managing all building materials which contain asbestos. Included in the AHERA Act is the requirement to annually notify all workers and building occupants (or their guardians) of asbestos-related activities. Beginning in 1988, all buildings owned, leased, or "under the control of" the School District were inspected by EPA accredited inspectors, with building material samples analyzed by an independent laboratory. Based on the inspection, the School District prepared, and the state approved a comprehensive management plan for managing the asbestos. Where the asbestos-containing materials are found, the School District has an Operations and Maintenance Program in place. The School District has accomplished the following compliance mandates regarding the administration of asbestos in school buildings: • Environmental Management Consulting, Inc. (EMC) was contracted to be the School District's consultant for asbestos for the school year. • The School District is continuing with the Operations and Maintenance Program as designed. This ensures that all asbestos materials are kept in good condition. • Periodic "surveillance" in each area containing asbestos has been completed every six (6) months by our consultant. Also, the buildings are re-inspected by an accredited inspector every three (3) years. • In the past year, the School District conducted the following asbestos removal activities: Community Pathways Center, 2333 Northwestern Ave., Racine, WI 53404 All outside contractors shall contact the lead maintenance person before commencing work. The School District's goal is to be in full compliance with asbestos regulations. A copy of the Asbestos Management Plan is available for review by contacting the District Office. Questions related to this plan or any other asbestos concerns should be directed to the School District's designated person, Robert F. Tajnai (262-497-7100).
