We practice PBIS at Giese. It is our way of addressing behavior in a positive manner. It is an incentive based format which uses positive reinforcements. These include: Dojo points, classroom celebrations, publicized (schoolwide) awards and more. In order that students and classes are able to be recognized during this Remote Learning Time I'd like to share some virtual Do's and Don'ts.: *Do log into your class everyday. Do wear proper clothing. Do find a fantastic place to learn. Do arrive on time for class.*

Do all of your work. Do attend IXL, Intervention and/or Special Education Sessions. Do participate fully. Do turn in your work or check in with your teacher if you are unable to meet during the scheduled Synchronous times. 4 Yr Old Kindergarten – October Newsletter 2020 FOR REMOTE START >>>

RULE TIME: The children are learning new rules for school. We are reminded by Busy Bee to "be Safe and be Kind." We also will be learning how to solve problems using solution cards and a technique or friend Tucker Turtle will teach us. Our school wide PBIS rules are "be respectful, be responsible, be safe, and be kind."

LEARNING TIME: Thank you families for leading your child in the start of our Remote Non-Technology learning. We have seen great attitudes, good listening, and even having an "I Can Attitude!" The best way to learn is to try and experiment and try again and again. It has been amazing to spend time one-on-one with your child. I look forward to when we go live with our District Technology each morning. Be ready at 8am each morning.

ASQ SCREENING TIME: I will continue to schedule ASQ screener meetings with your family and child. Part 1 is completing the Social & Emotional Questionnaire. Part 2 will take longer and your child will need to participate. We will cover these developmental areas of Fine Motor, Gross Motor, Communication, Problem Solving, and Personal and Social.

Kindergarten newsletter for September/October

We have started this school year with working on packets and awaiting the technology devices. We ask

that the families contact the teachers daily with information as to what was done in the area of reading

and math so we may mark your child participating for the day.

For Phonics & Reading, we have now learned the letters Nn, Aa, Bb, & Ff. We are beginning to learn

about the letter Tt as well. We also have learned the word an. We've learned the importance of listening to sounds and have begun to learn how to count words in sentences and syllables in words.

During Math, we have been introduced to an array of skills such as positional words, numbers 1-20, the

beginning of adding by joining 2 groups, and recognizing some 2D & 3D shapes. We will now retrace our

steps and practice these skills at a slower pace to have a clearer understanding of them all. Each month, we will share one of the Standards you will see listed on the Progress Report so you can

understand our goals for the year. This month, we will share: K.RF.2 – Demonstrate understanding

spoken words, syllables, and sounds (phonemes). This means your child will show how words and their

parts go together by rhyming, dividing words into syllables, take apart sounds, and can tell the beginning, middle, and ending sounds of simple words. We also need to know the letters and their

sounds so we can do this.

FIRST GRADE- Mrs. Ferguson Rm 19; Ms. Kossman Rm 20

Hello, First Grade Families! We're excited to see you on Monday, October 5, 2020. Classes begin at 8 am. Prior to our first meeting, please ensure that your student is able to login through the Google Classroom Google Meet. We will be using that class code for all future remote class meetings. *Your child's attendance in these remote class meetings is mandatory--and your child should be logged on from 8 am to 1:40 pm.*

There will be set breaks throughout the day; however, please be sure that your child returns promptly at the set end-of-break time.

Throughout these first few days and weeks, we will need your continuous support as we navigate this online learning environment. Here are a few class expectations we would like you to review with your child.

- How to treat your device
 - o Keeping your device fully charged (plugging in at night)
 - o Keep your device in a safe place.
 - o Carry with two hands.
 - o Use a moistened cloth to wipe the device down.
 - o Keep food and drinks away from your device.
 - o Login and use only district authorized websites.
 - o Device should only be used for school work (videos, selfies, and pictures take up needed storage space)
- Find a comfortable and quiet place to do your work.
- School supplies should be at arm's reach, ready to be used throughout the school day.
- Your mic should be muted at all times, unless asked to do otherwise.
- Adhere to school rules, by being safe, being respectful, and being responsible.
- If these expectations are not met, there will be logical consequences.

The activities we will be doing may require some of the following supplies. These supplies may be found at your local Dollar Store. Having these supplies will contribute to your child's success in this new learning environment.

- Headphones (earbuds or over-the-ear)
- Dry erase marker
- Paper/notebook
- Pocket folder without rings

- Pencils/eraser/sharpener
- Crayons
- Scissors
- Glue

We are looking forward to a successful beginning of remote learning. Please be patient. We are in this together. Please reach out if you have any questions or concerns.

Hello families, The first month of the school year flew by! We now have technology and materials for Second Graders! The pick up times are: October 1st from 3-7 pm and October 2nd from 8 am-3 pm at Giese Elementary School. It's important to pick it up because full time remote learning will start the following weekOur first day of full time remote learning is currently October 5th, 2020. Please make an area for your child that will be optimal for their learning. During this time, if your child is having trouble with their technology please contact the Student Call Center. The number is 1-844-989-2943. They will be able to help with any technology problems.

We are going to be sending more information about the apps and programs we will be using in the classroom. We have already introduced Google Classroom but will also be using IXL, RazKids, SeeSaw and more. We will be sending out passwords and usernames for your child via ClassDojo soon.

The attendance recording will be changing when full time remote learning begins. Attendance will be taken in the morning and afternoon during the Google Meet instruction. In order for your child to be marked as participating for the day, your child must attend both morning and afternoon online class sessions. If your child is going to miss the morning or afternoon session please message your child's teacher via ClassDojo for the make-up work. The district guide states that your child can still be marked participating if all the work missed, is completed and turned in work within 48 hours. If you have any questions or concerns please contact your child's teacher.

We are so excited to start full time remote learning and getting to see your child everyday! Please don't hesitate to let us know if you have any questions or concerns.

Our next math chapter will focus on addition of numbers up to 6 digits and more review of multiplication.

We understand that this is all new for them and if they are having trouble please let us know. A few reminders. If your child is going to be absent please let the office know first so that attendance can be recorded accordingly. You may also let your child's teacher know via Doio as well. If you are not connected to Doio please reach out to your child's teacher to get an invitation sent. If your child is unable to attend class they can still make up the work to be counted as present. Per the district attendance policy for virtual learning any child marked as not present has 48 hours to complete any missed work. The work will be posted in Google Classroom and it is their responsibility to complete the work before the 48 hours is up. If you have any questions, reach out to your child's teacher. Please have headphones available to all children, when sitting closely to an older sibling, the background noise can be quite confusing and is not allowing students to focus as well as they could.
